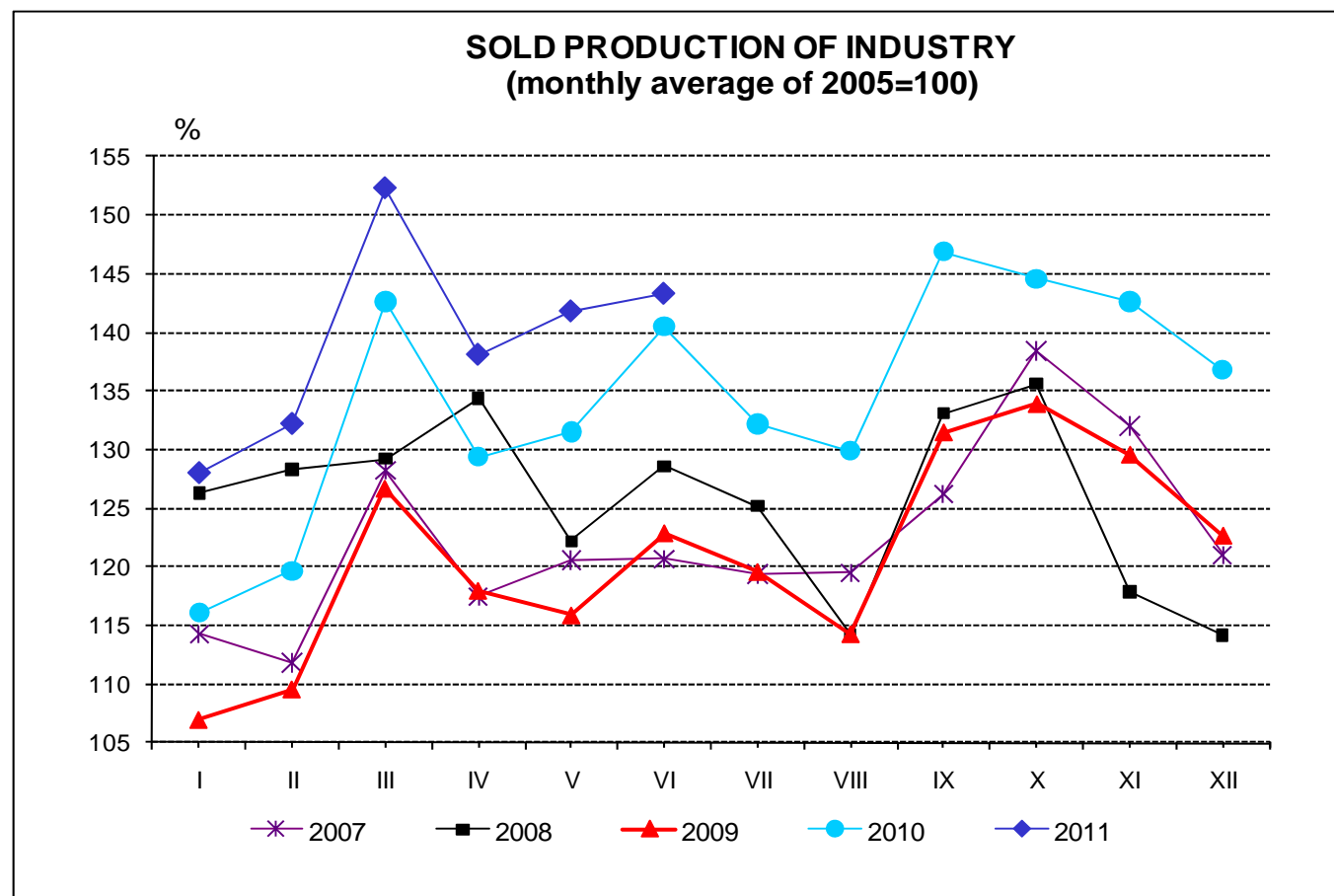

According to the preliminary data **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons) in June 2011 was by 2.0% higher than in the previous year (when the highest growth was recorded in 2010 – by 14.3%) and by 1.1% higher than in May 2011. Having eliminated the influence of seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level higher by 4.5% than in the corresponding month of the previous year, but lower by 2.2% than in May 2011.

As compared to June 2010, an increase in sold production was reported in 23 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in manufacture of basic metals – by 22.1%, manufacture of metal products – by 20.5%, manufacture of furniture – by 18.7%, manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products – by 16.9% (the high growth in the previous month – by 26.7%), manufacture of rubber and plastic products – by 10.0% and manufacture of electrical equipment – by 8.3%. A drop in sold production of industry, as compared to June 2010, was recorded in 11 divisions, among others, in, manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products – by 30.5% (with an increase in the previous year – by 97.6%), manufacture of machinery and equipment – by 11.5%, manufacture of pharmaceutical products – by 6.8% and in mining of coal and lignite – by 3.2%.

In the period January-June 2011 sold production of industry was by 7.4% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2005 are presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data **construction and assembly production** (in constant prices), including investment and repair work, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons in June of 2011 was by 17,0% higher than in the previous year and by 17,6% higher than in May of 2011. After eliminating the seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached the level by 15,3% higher than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 0,4% higher in comparison to May of 2011.

In comparison to June of the previous year, an increase in production occurred in enterprises whose basic type of activity is civil engineering – by 40,2% and specialized construction activities – by 22,8%. In turn, a drop was recorded in entities dealing mainly with construction of buildings – by 3,8%.

In comparison to May of 2011, an increase in production was recorded in all divisions of construction. In enterprises whose basic type of activity is civil engineering, the increase amounted to 27,6%, in units dealing mainly with construction of buildings 12,0% and in entities carrying out specialized construction activities 10,7%.

The level of construction and assembly production realised in the period January-June of 2011 was by 20,8% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.
