According to preliminary data, **the prices of sold production of industry** in March of 2011 were by 1.4% higher than in the previous month. The growth of prices was recorded in manufacturing (by 1.8%), of which the biggest in manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products (by 8.5%). Prices were raised also among other things in manufacture of chemicals and chemical products (by 2.4%), of food products (by 2.2%), of basic metals, of textiles (by 2.1% each), of rubber and plastic products (by 1.5%), of paper and paper products (by 1.4%), of machinery and equipment, of beverages, of pharmaceutical products, of leather and related products (by 1.1% each), of printing and reproduction of recorded media, of wearing apparel (by 1.0% each), of wood, cork, straw and wicker (by 0.9%), of tobacco products (by 0.8%), of metal products, of other transport equipment (by 0.7% each), of electrical equipment, of other non-metallic mineral products (by 0.4% each), of furniture, of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers (by 0.3% each). However the drop prices was recorded among other things in manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products (of 0.5%). The increase of prices was recorded in section electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (by 0.1%). The drop prices was recorded in mining and quarrying (by 0.5%), of which in mining of metal ores by 2.1% while in mining of coal and lignite was recorded growth prices by 0.6%. The drop was also recorded in section water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (by 0.5%).

In March of 2011 the prices of sold production of industry were by 9.3% higher than a year earlier (against a drop of 2.6% a year earlier). The highest growth of prices was recorded in mining and quarrying (of 21.9%). The prices were also increased in sections: manufacturing (of 9.3%), water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities (of 6.0%) as well as electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply (of 3.7%).

It is estimated that the **prices of construction and assembly production** in March of 2011 were by 0.2% higher than in the previous month. A growth price was recorded in construction of buildings as well as in civil engineering (by 0.2% each) and in specialised construction activities (by 0.1%).

In comparison to March of the previous year, the prices of construction and assembly production growth by 0.6% (against a drop of 0.5% a year earlier).

XII 2009 = 100

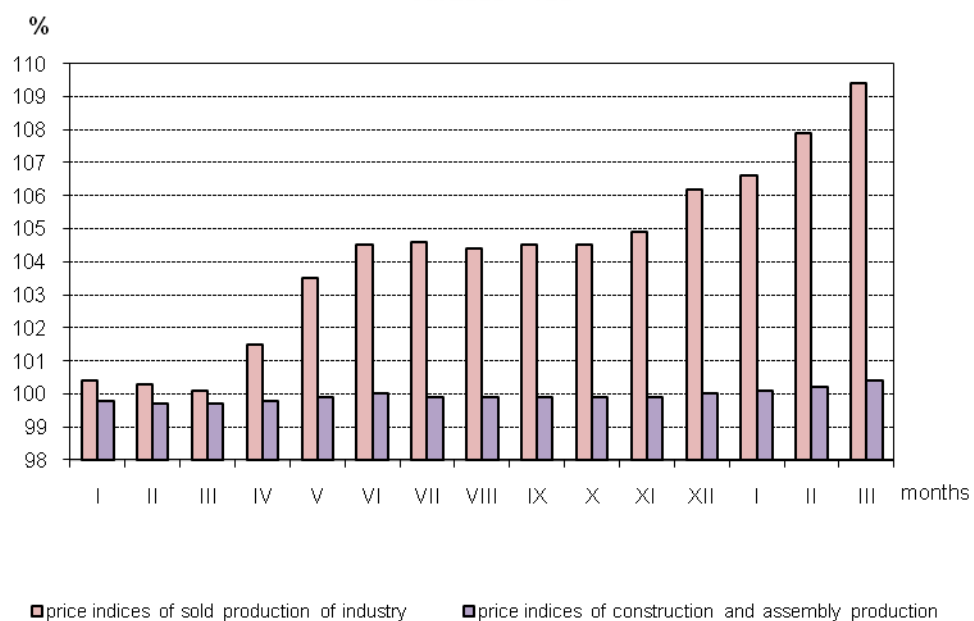
